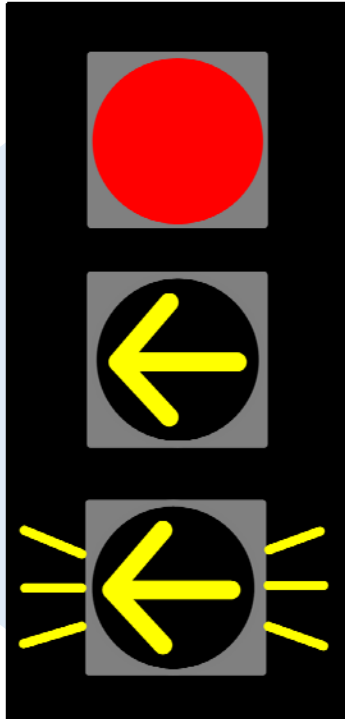


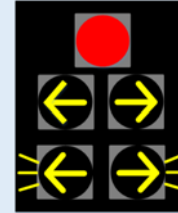
# Stevens Creek Blvd & Henry Ave Traffic Signal Project

## Project Update

The new traffic signal at Stevens Creek Boulevard and Henry Avenue is scheduled to be turned on during the month of September 2018. Due to the unique intersection geometry and through movement restrictions on Henry Avenue, a new Flashing Yellow Arrow (FYA) signal is being used to draw attention to pedestrians and conflicting vehicles. FYA signals have been proven to improve safety and reduce driver confusion. Drivers along Henry Avenue approaching Stevens Creek Boulevard will see:



## How Does a Flashing Yellow Arrow Turn Signal Work?

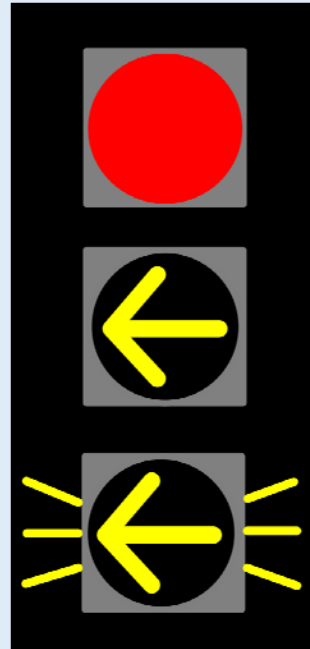
FYA means drivers must yield to oncoming traffic and pedestrians.

### This:

Solid  
Red

Steady  
Yellow  
Arrow

Flashing  
Yellow  
Arrow



### Means:

**STOP.** Drivers must stop. Drivers can make a right turn against a solid red light after stopping and when it is safe. Do not turn if a “no turn on red” sign is posted.

**WARNING.** Drivers are warned that the signal is about to turn red. Prepare to stop if it is safe to do so.

**CAUTION.** Drivers must yield to pedestrians and oncoming traffic prior to making the turn. Drivers do not have an exclusive right-of-way.
